## Press Release

### DDPM summarizes 5 provinces still flood

November 29, 2010

Ministry of Interior by Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation reports that 46 provinces flood are getting improved. While, 5 provinces, 14 districts, 102 sub-districts, 607 villages, 67,770 households, 215,047 people affected and 255 people died. Flood still exists 2 Northeast provinces in Kalasin and Roi Et, 1 Central province in Phra Nakorn Si Ayutthay and 2 Southern Province in Surat Thani, and Phattalung.

Mr. Wiboon Sanguanpong, Director – General of Department of Disaster Prevention and Mitigation stated that 51 total affected provinces, 558 districts, 3,972 sub-districts, 32,523 villages, 2,612,472 households, 8,970,653 people. While 46 provinces are getting improved. Presently, 5 provinces, 14 districts, 102 sub-districts, 607 villages, 67,770 households, 215,047 people and 255 dead toll nationwide affected from flood.

For Northeast, Eastern, Central Part, 39 provinces, 425 districts, 3,098 sub-districts, 26,226 villages, 2,002,961 households, 7,038,248 people affected. Whereas, 36 provinces namely; Lamphun, Chaing Mai, Kampangetch, Pitsanuloke, Pichit, Petchabun, Uthaitani, Chainart, Chaiyaphum, Nakhonsawan, Khon Kaen, Mahasarakham, Nongbualamphu, Surin, Nakhonratchasima, Ubonratchathani, Srisaket, Rayong, Chantaburi, Trad, Tak, Chonburi, Srakaew, Saraburi, Nakhonnayok, Prachinburi, Samutprakarn, Nakhonpathom, Buriram, Chaeongsao, Anghong, Lopburi, Nonthaburi, Pathumthani, Suphanburi and Singburi.

Presently, 3 provinces, 9 districts, 75 sub-districts, 438 villages, 35,305 households, 111,046 people, farmland 7,78,368 rai affected from flood, 177 people died. Flood still exists in 2 northeastern provinces namely; Kalasin and Roi Et including 1 central province; Phra Nakhorn Si Ayutthay.

In Southern area, 12 provinces, 133 districts, 874 sub-districts, 6,197 villages, 609,511 households, 1,932,405 people affected. 10 provinces are getting improved namely ; Satun, Narathiwat, Yala, Krabi, Chumporn, Ranong, Pattani, Trang, Songkla and Nakhon Si Thammarat. Flood still exists in 2 provinces (Surat Thani and Phattalung), 5 districts, 27 sub-districts, 169 villages, 32,465 households, 104,001 people affected from flood and 78 people died.

## Press Release

Flood details as the followings regions and provinces;

### **2 provinces in Northeast Region**

#### **Kalasin Province**

Inundation at Shi River causes 2 districts (Klongchai and Kamolasai), 3 sub-districts, 11 villages, 48 households, 166 people affected and expects approximately 43,964 rai of farmland was destroyed.

#### **Roi Et Province**

Inundation at Shi and Moon River causes 3 districts (Janghan, Ponsai and Chiangkwan district), 8 sub-districts, 34 villages, 905 households, 2,738 people affected and expects approximately 39,822.5 rai of farmland was destroyed.

### **1 province in Central Region**

#### **Ayutthaya Province**

4 districts (Bangsai, Maharat, Pakhai and Bangban), 34,352 households, 108,142 people affected

### **2 provinces in Southern Region**

#### **Surat Thani Province**

2 districts (Punpin and Bannadern), 3,373 households, 10,775 people affected and 261,784 rai of farmland destroyed

#### **Phattalung Province**

3 districts (Muang, Khaochaison and Kuankanun), 29,092 households, 93,226 people affected and 482,330 rai of farmland ruined.

DDPM Regional Center and DDPM Provincial Offices with the concerned agencies cooperation dispatched 2,000 rescue boats, 500,000 relief kits, 4,600 temporary tents, 17 drinking water production trucks, 400,000 drinking water bottles, 400 water pumps, 700 rescue trucks, 15 lighting trucks, 4,120,000 sand bags, 33,000 medicine sets, 700 warm clothes, 7,158 mobile toilets, 2,800 officials to support victim and conduct damage assessment. Moreover, DDPM will expedite the victim compensation according to Ministry of Finance Regulation.
